Minutes of Board of Trustees Meeting

July 7, 2025

A regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Woodson, Illinois was held July 7, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. President Bruce Milner called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The following Trustees were present for the roll call: Tobin, Allen, Edwards, Steward, and Wilson.
